The Swansea Historical Society's "Take a Step Back in Time" event held at the Luther Store on December 13th and 14th was a huge success!

The event was designed to help visitors take a step back in time and see what a 1880s store looked like. It was also a sneak peak of the Luther Store which has been closed for over 5 years for repairs and restoration. The Luther Store is now ready to greet the public.

Visitors could view toys from the 1800s, children's clothing, a collection of 1800s clocks and much more.

There were many items available for purchase including Christmas ornaments from the 1800s, candy that would have been sold at the Luther Store, baked goods, small crafts and SHS memorabilia.

A Circus Comes to Swansea

Sells & Gray circus, also called "Sells & Gray United Shows" came to Swansea during 1972. Named after Great William Sells and James H. Gray, this traveling circus was very popular from 1960-1978. Colorful date specific posters were screen printed and sent to the sponsor well in advance of set-up crews who arrived in town 2 days ahead of the circus. These posters were used as local advertising, and numbers issued were dependent on the size of the town. A town the size of Swansea may have been issued 10-15 posters, making surviving posters very rare. Sponsors were needed to invite the circus to your town, in this case "Auspices; V.F.W."

This smaller circus was ideal for smaller towns and traveled with 14 trucks displaying colorful advertising. The circus presented two shows, and was in town just a single day. Then the circus moved to the next town, usually less than 70 miles away.



These travel cards are not as rare as the posters for collectors, who also collect used ticket stubs.

Collectors search for posters like mine, and often bring \$80.00 to \$250.00 depending on condition. This circus only came to Swansea one time in 1972. Sells & Gray came twice to the neighboring town of Rehoboth in 1972, and 1974.

My poster's date 06/30 is different than the travel card date of 07/24. This is a mystery as research is ongoing.

Clyde Beatty-Cole Bros. circus came to Swansea during 1977 for 4 days, 06/23 - 06/26. This was a larger, rail-based circus. Clyde Beatty-Cole Bros. offered larger, more elaborate shows, suitable for longer engagements in one location.

The History of the Luther Store

Joseph Gardner Luther, Jr., September 22, 1837 to January 13, 1925, willed the Luther store and grounds to the seven remaining Luther descendants.

In 1936, Luther descendants were no longer able to take care of the building and offered it to the town of Swansea to be used as a museum or monument. The building was accepted at a town meeting.

In early 1937, the building was put on the demolition list by the Town of Swansea, owners of the building, due to several automobile accidents at the corner, some fatal. These accidents were recurring because the Luther Store was a visual obstruction located too close to the corner.

In 1937, the Luther descendants approached Marian Reilly for help to stop demolition. At a 1938 town meeting, the Town of Swansea voted to turn the Luther Store over to the Swansea Historical Society once it was established. Due to language in the deed, the founder and president of the Swansea Historical Society, Marian Reilly, would not except the store and land unless the language in the deed was changed.

In the deed, it stated if the Swansea Historical Society did not keep the building up to the town specifications, the ownership will revert back to the Town of Swansea for demolition.

Marian would not accept these terms. She paid for a lawyer out of her own pocket and took the Town of Swansea to court. It was 11 years before the Town of Swansea finally decided they would sign over the deed with no stipulations.

Marian Reilly filed paperwork to establish the Swansea Historical Society in 1938. The Swansea Historical Society was established January 1941, 85 years ago this month.

Mrs. Lane from the Cedar Lane Dairy donated the land so the building could be moved back.

Marian Reilly, being a Luther on her mother's side, contacted Maude Parlin, an architect from Fall River, and Grace Hartley Howe, wife of President Roosevelt's assistant, Louis McHenry Howe and first female postmaster. She served in Fall River. Grace Hartley Howe and Maude Parlin worked

together to get Works Progress Administration (WPA) funds to save the building.

In the meantime...

They were successful in getting the WPA to save the Luther Store. Terms of the agreement: The WPA funds would pay for the foundation and moving the building back away from the corner as long as, 1) the building was used as a museum, 2) a historical society was established and, 3) they held their meetings in the building.

Marian Reilly paid for the new roof on the store, paid for all repairs to the building due to the move. She also paid for structural repairs to the first floor. There were two donations made at that time. Two gentlemen gave \$1,000 each to be used for the repairs of the store. The second floor was not used until 1968 because there were no funds to fix the structural issues. It was used for storage only.

The Swansea Historical Society became the legal owners of the Luther Store June 1952. The town voted to hand the store over to the Swansea Historical Society.
