ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE Describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within the community.

One of a few Dutch Colonial structures in Swansea, located near an early 19th century node - Swansea Center/ Luther's Corner. Built ca. 1740, this Dutch Colonial features the typical characteristics - 1½ - story gambrel with no eave overhang on the gable ends, central stone chimney. The original structure is the southern section. It would be interesting to note what is under the asbestos.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE Explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community.

John Luin, probably of Dutch descent, is thedocumented first owner and possible builder of this house, There was no Luin history found. The significance lies in the fact that this structure was part of the Swansea Center/ Luther's Corner Village node a and this house is representative of what the middle class merchants, seamen and farmers were building. It is interesting to note that in 1850 it was a Parsonage for the Christian Congregational Church; by 1871 it was a farmhouse; and a residence in 1924. It is now a multiple family unit.


