As part of the Barneyville Historic District, 60 Barneyville Road meets criterion C of the National Register of Historic Place. #60 Barneyville Road represents the latest significant period in its Revival architecture and is associated with the Barney family.

## ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE Describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within the community.

This 1-1/2-story, vernacular Colonial Revival clapboard farmhouse built in 1903 is a typical and good example. This simple folkhouse farm has elements of Victorian decorative detailing in brackets, porch and simple door and window surrounds.

# HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE Explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community.

Nocated on a large (16 acres) parcel that stretches down to the Palmer/Warren River, the John Barney Farm, built in 1903, is the last of significant historical structures in Barneyville. John Barney was a descendant of Jonathan and Mason Barney for whom the area was named. He built his farm between two other Barney family parcels.
