

ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE Describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within the community.

As one of the original seven houses of "The Colony," No. 15 Mattapoisett Avenue built in 1898, is a fairly large but plain dwelling in the shingle style. This two and a half story, four-bay square house is distinguished by its encompassing gambrel roof line which incorporated a portion of the three-sided porch with simple porch supports and spindles. The shed triple dormer has two over two lights as do the other windows in the house.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE Explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community.


